BART Silicon Valley Phase II Extension to San Jose and Santa Clara

San Jose, California New Starts Project Development Information Prepared January 2018

The Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) proposes to extend the Bay Area Rapid Transit District (BART) Silicon Valley (BSV) service 6.5 miles from the Berryessa Station through downtown San Jose to the City of Santa Clara. VTA expects the project will include four stations, five miles of subway tunnels, 48 heavy rail vehicles, and a maintenance facility. The project is being implemented by VTA in partnership with BART. The project's current estimated capital cost is \$4.69 billion. VTA has not identified the amount of funds that will be sought from the New Starts program.

VTA indicates the project would provide rail service that will close the regional rail gap between East Bay and Santa Clara in the West Bay, increase transit ridership in a corridor with ever-increasing travel demand, and improve mobility options to employment, education, entertainment, medical, and retail centers in the corridor.

VTA selected a locally preferred alternative (LPA) in November 2001, which was adopted into the region's fiscally constrained long-range transportation plan in December 2008. The project entered New Starts Project Development in March 2016. VTA anticipates completion the environmental review process with receipt of a Record of Decision from FTA in June 2018, receipt of a Full Funding Grant Agreement in May 2019, and the start of revenue service in June 2026.
