New Resources

NTD Narrative Report Example Format: This updated resource is intended to support agencies with developing their narrative reports for the National Transit Database. The user-friendly tool provides prompts for information that could be useful for inclusion in reports. This resource, which replaces and combines the example format and the sample that were previously available, provides better guidance on the level of detail to include in an agency's narrative report along with sample language for agencies to include in their reports. FTA encourages transit agencies to download and review the document in advance of their next annual submission.

Articles

FTA announces funding opportunity for low or no emission transit vehicles & facilities:

FTA <u>announced \$180 million in grant funding</u> for transit agencies to purchase or lease low- or no- emission vehicles and to support facilities that use advanced technologies to provide cleaner, more energy efficient transit operations in communities across the country. FTA will prioritize applications with an environmental justice component along with those that support workforce development activities to help America's transit workers succeed. Apply by April 12.

Casco Bay Lines uses its TAM Plan to prioritize investments: Casco Bay Island Transit District is <u>updating part of its fleet of vessels</u> based on the metrics laid out in the agency's TAM Plan. The agency used its TAM Plan during its long-range planning process to coordinate with partners and secure funding for the design and construction of a new ferry prior to their existing assets exceeding their useful life.

MetroTransit completes signal upgrades to improve system reliability: Metro Transit replaced outdated equipment at 10 intersections with a new technology that will improve communication between traffic lights for motor vehicles and the system that controls trains. The technology will boost on-time performance and improve system reliability by providing trains with more time to pass through intersections without having to stop.
