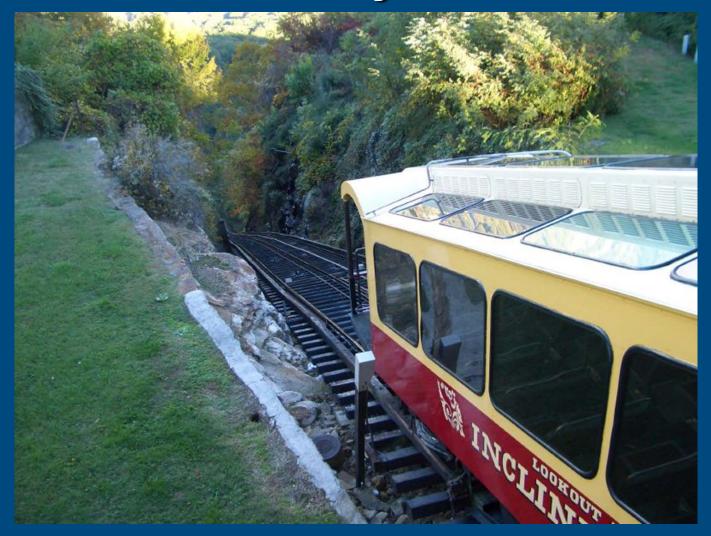

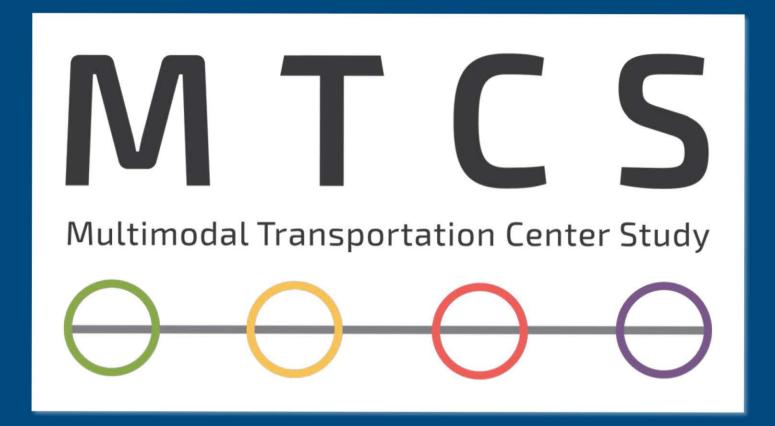

The 2010 Application

<u>Long Term Vision</u>: To create opportunities for a true multi-modal continuum of transportation options (from walking, personal bicycle, public bicycle sharing system, electric shuttle circulator transit system, main-line transit, flexible car sharing system, personal automobile)

<u>Why Bike Share</u>: Bicycle sharing has been demonstrated to be highly suitable option for trips fewer than 3 miles

Bike Station:
Building/Station infrastructure
10-15 bikes per station
An educational kiosk

Financial: \$2,075,000 Total (CMAQ, flexed to FTA) •Stations w/ 15 bikes, kiosk, and overhead = \$52,500/station •30 Stations = \$1,575,000 •Programming & O&M = \$500,000 (3 yrs.)

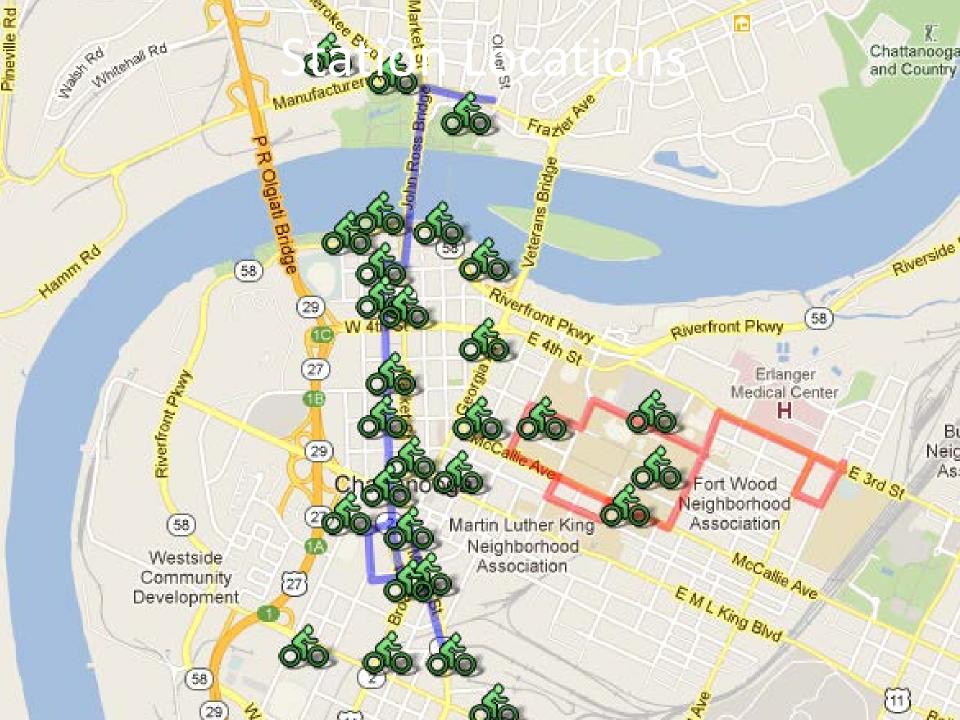

HOW IT WORKS



1. Buy Purchase 24-hour access, Ride as many times as you want for 24 hours.

2. Take



Choose a bike and enter your unlocking code on the dock to release it.



3. Ride

Run errands. Meet a friend. Get to work or class. Don't forget your helmet and watch your ride time!



4. Return

You can return your bike to any Bike Chattanooga station.

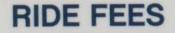


5. Repeat Wait 5 minutes to restart the clock and then check out a new bike!

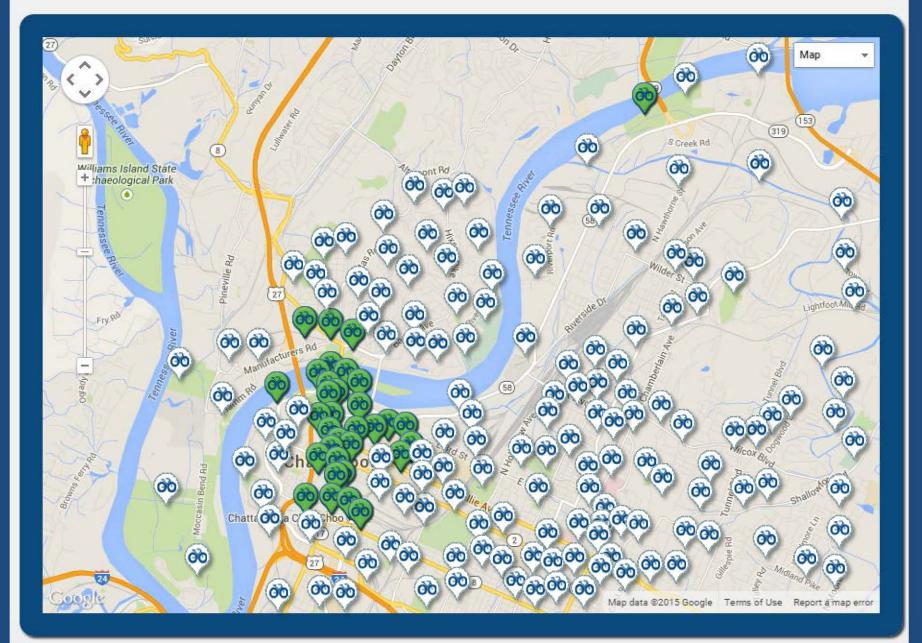






STATION MAP
