


Multimodal Feasibility Study



TIGER 2013 Quick Facts:

- •\$474 million available for projects having a significant impact on the nation, a metropolitan area, or region.
- Capital investments in surface transportation infrastructure.
- •\$10M Minimum Project
- Minimum 20% Non-Federal Match Required
- •\$9.1B of grant requests were received with over 1,500 applications nationwide, from every state.
- •\$123M of the \$474M available was earmarked for Rural Projects.
- •\$351 available to Urban Projects only 27 awards made.






