The Advisory Council on Historical Preservation (ACHP) is pleased to announce the 2012 Section 106 Essentials Course schedule. The highlighted dates are in the Region 10 area.

**The Section 106 Essentials**, <http://www.achp.gov/106essentials.html#forms>, is a two-day course designed for those who are new to Section 106 review or those who want a refresher on its basic operation. This course explains the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, which applies any time a federal, federally assisted, or federally approved activity might affect a property listed in or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.
