Subject: NTI Introduction to Transit Asset Management Course

The National Transit Institute (NTI) will be presenting a FREE course (\$300 for contractors, consulting, non-USA transportation or Government agencies) concerning **“Introduction to Transit Asset Management”** in Seattle, Washington on May 20-21, 2014.

Transit asset management represents a strategic approach to managing transit assets. It focuses on an agency's business processes for resource allocation and utilization with the objective of better decision-making based upon quality information and well-defined objectives. The key principles of asset management represent a perspective that a department can adopt in looking at its current procedures and seeing how better decisions on infrastructure can be made with better information.

This course is directed at mid- and senior-level managers who are involved in the day-to-day operation and use transit assets including rolling stock, guideway, and facilities to perform their duties. The individuals attending this course could be in the operations, maintenance, facilities, infrastructure and financial areas. Executive management will also benefit from the course.
