 - We scored low in waste and water quality

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Mayor Gray's Vision

- On July 27, 2011, Mayor Gray announced development of a comprehensive sustainability strategy to make our city "the most sustainable city in the U.S." He cited the need for:
 - An overarching framework and vision
 - Dedicated staff
 - Extensive public outreach and buy-in
 - Tying actions directly to agency budgets
 - Indicators for success
- Mayor Gray tasked the Office of Planning (OP) and Department of the Environment (DDOE) to lead this effort


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What will the plan be?




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Ex. How to manage stormwater: LID or tanks?
