CCAM Background



What is the CCAM?

The Coordinating Council on Access and Mobility (CCAM) is an interagency partnership established by Executive Order to coordinate the efforts of the federal agencies that fund transportation services for targeted populations.



Mission

The CCAM issues policy recommendations and implements activities that improve the **availability**, **accessibility**, and **efficiency** of transportation for the following targeted populations:

Equal access to coordinated transportation for all Americans

Why is transportation coordination important?


Transportation coordination allows human service providers to assist more people in a cost-efficient manner.

80 federal programs fund transportation for targeted populations...



...but these programs are often duplicative and fragmented.

Which VA programs fund transportation?

The following VA programs may fund transportation services for Veterans and their families and therefore fall under the purview of the CCAM.

Program	Type of Assistance	Purpose
Veterans Transportation Program	Project Grants	Offers Veterans travel solutions to and from their VA health care facilities
Veterans State Adult Day Health Care	Formula Grants	Provides Veterans who need skilled services, case management, and help with activities of daily living with a place to go during the day for social activities, peer support, companionship, and recreation
VA Homeless Providers Grant and Per Diem Program	Project Grants	Promotes the development and provision of supportive housing and/or supportive services that help homeless Veterans achieve residential stability, increase their skill levels and/or income, and obtain greater self-determination
Automobiles and Adaptive Equipment for Certain Disabled Veterans and Members of the Armed Forces	Direct Payments for Specified Use	Provides financial assistance to certain disabled servicepersons and Veterans toward the purchase price of an automobile or other conveyance and an additional amount for adaptive equipment to insure the eligible person will be able to operate or make use of the automobile or other conveyance
